By rewarding accuracy with a tiered scoring system—ranging from 5 to 15 points—Media Mantra serves as a comprehensive platform for aspiring media professionals to demonstrate their analytical prowess and familiarity with the broadcast industry.

1. Bridge Kriti is a technical model-making competition aimed at enhancing structural understanding, creativity, and teamwork among students.
2. All participants must maintain discipline, professionalism, and safety throughout the event.
3. Any form of misbehavior, indiscipline, or violation of rules may lead to immediate disqualification.
4. Participants must strictly follow the instructions of coordinators and judges.
5. The Event Coordinator reserves the right to modify rules or take decisions in special or unforeseen circumstances.
6. The decision of the Coordinator and Judging Panel shall be final and binding.
7. Judges' decisions cannot be questioned or appealed.

1. The bridge must satisfy the following dimensional requirements:
  - o Minimum total length: 600 mm
  - o Clear span (inner wall distance): 500 mm
  - o Height above deck: 100 mm – 200 mm
  - o Height below deck: 100 mm – 150 mm
  - o Deck width: 80 mm – 120 mm
2. A clearance of 25 mm at either end below the bridge deck must be maintained.
3. A matchbox car (approx.  $30 \times 70 \times 25$  mm) must be able to roll smoothly across the bridge deck.
4. The roadway portion of the bridge must be capable of supporting the load distribution plate.

## **Testing Rules**

1. The bridge must not apply load to the vertical faces of the support structure during testing.
2. Bridges will be weighed before testing.
3. Load will be applied at the mid-span from below on the bridge deck.
4. Loading will continue until:
  - o The bridge fails, or
  - o The deflection exceeds 50 mm.
5. The peak load achieved will be considered the failure load.
6. All bridges will be destroyed during testing.
7. Only bridges complying with all rules will be tested and considered for prizes.

## **Judging & Evaluation Criteria**

1. Bridges will be evaluated on performance, efficiency, and aesthetics.
2. Participants must explain the concept and load transfer mechanism of their bridge during testing.
3. Scoring Criteria:
  - o Deflection at yield (d): 40%

- o Efficiency (Failure Load / Bridge Weight): 30%
- o Aesthetics & design detailing: 30%

4. Total Score (S) = d + e + a
5. The judging panel's decision will be final and binding.
