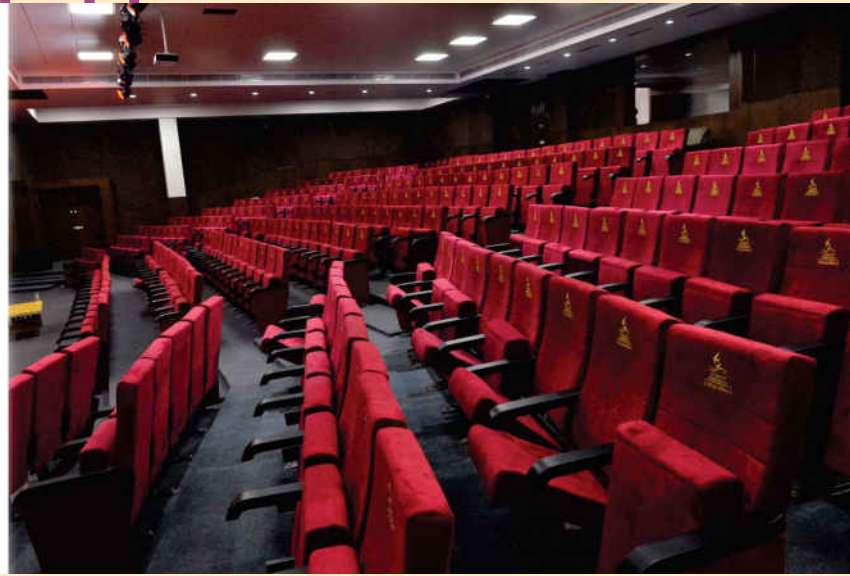




MU gets a well equipped new Auditorium

Identify the goal of your life : Jayant Dawar tells students

A well known Industrialist, Mr. Jayant Dawar visited the Mangalayatan University and emphasized on the identification of purpose to achieve in life rather than bothering about what to study and what business to start. Dawar, Co-Chairman and Managing Director of Sindhar Technologies (India's largest manufacturing Automobile Industry that manufactures lock systems and other hardware) shared his life experiences with the students and faculty members of the University under National Lecture Series. 'You need to think faster than time to reach the heights of the sky. Don't only look for the sources that you can use to fulfill the present need of the society; rather you must go beyond that. You need to think about the future needs and requirements of the society and then develop the idea of its production to fulfill the requirement that are going to arise in near future', Dawar said.

He added that the real entrepreneur is the one who can introduce a device or machine which can't be separated from the lives of people. He gave the example of mobile phones, as there was a time when people did not even have the telephone at their home. And now it is difficult to imagine a life without a mobile phone. A true Industrialist identifies those needs of the society that are yet to arise.

Giving the glimpse of the near future, Dawar gave his vision that the days are not far away when students will not come to Mangalayatan University in the buses, but in drones flying in the sky, which indicated that time and society are changing



rapidly. Predicting the right future needs earliest will yield greater success.

“Idea is the key to be a successful entrepreneur”, he clearly stated. Adding to it he extended his talk, one will never go short of funds if he/she has a new and creative idea about the start up. For that building up of confidence within, is a necessary step by ensuring that the fear of defeat must not dominate over the passion of the success.

Expressing his grief over the current education scenario he presented a data that over sixteen lac students pass out from Engineering colleges every year, and none of them are worth hiring for Industrial employment. We need to change this system.

In the beginning of this lecture, Vice Chairman of Board of Governance Mr. Swapnil Jain while introducing the Chief Guest & his Company to the audiences said, the branches of Mr. Dawar's company, Sindhar Technologies is not only limited in

the regions of India but have its full-fledged branches in the countries including Spain, Mexico, Holland and more. Appreciating the Dawar's passion for work, Mr. Swapnil shared an incidence from his life when just after two days of his face surgery he left for abroad because his lecture in Howard University was scheduled.

Vice Chancellor, Prof. S. C. Jain while extending his gratitude towards Mr. Dawar complimented him for delivering an inspirational lecture to the students and faculties. Vaccine Developed to Fight Leprosy



- A vaccination has been developed in India to eradicate leprosy. Dr. UD Gupta, a renowned leprosy expert enlightened the students in a guest lecture organized in Mangalayatan University by Department of Biotechnology and Biomedical Education. Dr. Gupta is the Director of Jalma Institute of leprosy and other micro bacterial diseases (Agra) associated with Indian Council of Medical Research. He has travelled many countries including America, Brazil, China, Japan, Taiwan, and Nepal for his research.

- Dr. Gupta asserted that these vaccines have passed all the preliminary laboratory tests and would soon go for trial on those people who live in proximity to leprosy patients. He also said that the vaccination would remain effective till 5-8 years after administration. A capsule has also been developed for the same. Talking about the dreaded disease and its causes he said told that about 60% of leprosy patients live in India. The unhygienic living conditions and lack of nutritious food help the bacteria of leprosy to grow.

- The program commenced with the lightning of lamp by the Guest, Vice Chancellor Prof. SC Jain and Pro Vice Chancellor Prof. PS Siwach. Prof. Gaurav Mudgal introduced Dr. Gupta and talked about his stature at International platforms. Prof. Gaurav Chaudhary expressed his gratitude to Dr. Gupta for his guest lecture. Dr. Abdul Wadood honored the guest by presenting a memento to him.

Exercise is better than Medicines: Dr. Skinner

Veteran Faculty at Department of Kinesiology, Indiana University US, Dr. James S. Skinner in a Guest Lecture emphasised on the physical exercise by stating that if we want to save ourselves from the expenses of medicines and visits of the Hospitals. Dr. Skinner has held a number of positions in his profession, including President of the American College of Sports Medicine and Vice President of the



International Council on Sports Sciences and Physical Education. He has received honours from such organizations as the American College of Sports Medicine and the International Olympic Committee. He has written nearly 300 papers and seven books. He said it is better to prioritise exercise in life and stay fit

rather than spending on medicines and Hospital charges, because medicines always have certain side effects, where as exercise not only reduces the possibility of medicinal expenses but it has no side effects as well. As per him, 40% chances of heart diseases, 50% of Diabetes, 50% of Cancer and 60% of High Blood Pressure gets reduced in the people who do exercise regularly. The program was started as per the Indian

culture, where Dr Skinner along with Vice Chancellor Prof. S. C. Jain lighted the lamp in front of Goddess Saraswati. While introducing Skinner, Principal Prof. Abdul Wadood Siddiqui said that he is world known personality in his subject. Pro Vice Chancellor Prof. P. S. Siwach honoured him with a memento and thanked him for devoting time to Mangalayatan University.
